AI tools offer real efficiency gains at work — but they also introduce serious privacy risks that aren't always obvious. Explore the dangers of data leakage and shadow AI, what responsible AI use looks like in practice, and how emerging regulations like the EU AI Act are raising the bar.

Privacy in Practice

Privacy isn't just a policy on a shelf — it has to be built into how we work every day. Explore practical privacy habits, the Privacy by Design approach, how to conduct Privacy Impact Assessments, and what to do when security incidents or data events occur.
